- **Be Patient**: Understand that your new cat may hide or take time to adjust. This behavior is normal as they adapt to their new surroundings.
- **Monitor Interactions**: If you have other pets, introduce them slowly and carefully. Keep an eye on their interactions to ensure everyone feels safe.
- **Three-Day Rule**: Remember the general guideline: it takes about three days for a cat to acclimate, three weeks to feel confident, and three months to show their full personality.
